

# Mission: Kindness



Read these books from the BooksForTopics **Kindness Booklist** and complete the kindness missions! There are six missions to undertake - can you complete them all?



**Read: The Boy, the Troll and the Chalk**

**Mission:** Find a new way of connecting with somebody you don't always spend time with - perhaps playing a game or drawing together, or it could be as simple as a wave or smile. It might be a grandparent or a new pupil at school, or even an old friend you have not seen in a while.

**Read: Human Kindness**

**Mission:** Think about the kindness heroes in your life. Who do you know who sets a great example of human kindness? Perhaps you could find a way to celebrate your kindness heroes by writing them a thank you letter or telling others about them.




**Read: The Kindest Red**

**Mission:** In the story, Faizah says that she wants the world to be a *kind world* where friends help each other. Think about Faizah's small acts of kindness in the story. How many did you spot? Now see how many small acts of kindness between friends you can notice in one day, including your own!

**Read: The Smile**

**Mission:** Set out to smile at 20 people today. How far will your smile go? Try to notice the effect it has on other people - perhaps it will start a chain of kindness that spreads through your community and beyond!




**Read: Kind**

**Mission:** This book contains illustrations of kindness by 38 different artists! Choose one of the ideas drawn in the book to try out for yourself. It might be creating a kindness jar or sharing toys. Draw what you did. Sharing ideas for acts of kindness by drawing them can inspire others. Start a shared book or display of kindness ideas for your class or family to add to, to inspire even more kindness.

**Read: The Invisible**

**Mission:** Think about how Isabel decides to make a difference to her new community by improving small things that cost nothing. Choose something that you could do to brighten up your community for others. It could be tidying up a classroom space, planting flowers for others to enjoy, doing a litter pick or creating artwork to offer to community spaces like care homes or community centres.
